Jamestown

Motivations (why did England want to settle in Virginia?)

- an economic venture, or a way to make money
- to increase England's wealth and power
- · to find silver and gold
- to furnish raw materials that could not be grown in England, while opening new trade markets

Charter

- granted to the Virginia Company of London from the King of England
- gave permission to establish a settlement in North America
- extended English rights to settlers

Jamestown

- financed by the stockholders of the Virginia Company of London
- first permanent English settlement in America
- settlers arrived in 1607
- located on a narrow peninsula (water bordered on 3 sides)
- because of erosion, it is now an island on the James River

Hardships


- the site they chose to live on was marshy (swampy) and lacked safe drinking water
- settlers lacked survival skills, necessary to provide for themselves
- many settlers died of starvation and disease


Motivations (why did England choose Jamestown?)

- settlers were instructed to go inland and find a suitable place
- location could be easily defended from the Spanish
- water was deep enough for ships to dock
- settlers believed they had a good supply of fresh water

Changes made for survival

- arrival of supply ships
- forced work program
- strong leadership of Captain John Smith
- emphasis on agriculture (farming/ crops)
